




National Kidney Month

Spanish and bilingual lanyards

I'm thrilled to share our new Spanish and bilingual lanyards, designed to help people feel more at ease by choosing the language they're most comfortable with during interactions.

This initiative is deeply personal to me. Growing up as a Latina in a state with few people who looked like me or spoke my language, I've always been passionate about supporting those struggling with English. These lanyards represent a way to bridge gaps, creating a more welcoming environment and helping us educate more people about organ donation, which is central to our outreach.

I've already worn these lanyards at events, and the response has been inspiring. More people have stopped by our booth, noticed the lanyards, and expressed excitement about how we're working to make a difference. It's amazing to see how such a simple tool can foster connections and improve engagement.

For now, the lanyards are available internally for those certified in Spanish by our organization. Some will also be distributed to ambassadors, managed by our Volunteer Manager.

Looking ahead, we hope to expand this initiative to include more languages, making our outreach even more inclusive and accessible.

Together, we're breaking barriers and building stronger connections, one conversation at a time.
